The following is a summary of matters considered by the Advisory Council at its 69th meeting held on 18-19 February 2020.

Attendance by the Minister for Energy and Environment

The Hon Matt Kean MP met with the Council and discussed his priorities for national parks including protecting and expanding the national parks system, enhancing the quality of visitor experience and education and feral animal control. Council members discussed their role in providing strategic advice to the Minister about important issues affecting national parks.
