



Forest Carbon Strategy - presented to NPA (NSW) State Council meeting in Newcastle

20-Year *Regional Forest Agreements* (*RFAs*) on the GER stretch from the NSW North Coast (including proposed *Great Koala National Parks*) all the way down to Victoria's planned *Great Forest NP* of Mountain Ash near Melbourne. The *Australian Institute* and NPA's Dr.Oisin Sweeney published critical *NSW RFA Reports* in 2016. A '*NoWayRFA*' campaign group was convened in Melbourne today. For *Gippsland*, governments have extended the oldest *RFA* by a year to Feb 2018.

The "Alps-to-Sea" World Heritage VISION with Bob Debus' GER connects 3 regions:

- A. <u>Australian Alps NPs</u> (NSW/VIC/ACT 2008 National Heritage Listing) plus Alpine State Forests
- B. Gippsland Forest .. first connect new 2017 VIC Gov. NPs endorsed by VNPA, ACF and TWS
- C. South Coast Forest (Nowra to VIC border) .. connect/protect Jobs, Wildlife & Carbon Credits

Federally-funded Wilderness Coast National Landscapes Tourism also connects Gippsland & NSW.

On 9-Sep-16 the Victorian Premier announced its *Forest Industry Taskforce* 2017 recommendation will include "*Methods for valuing carbon in native forests*". In 2016, the NSW Premier also released its brief '*Forest Industry Roadmap*' stating "*Government wants carbon benefits from forest management …* so carbon credit revenue can fund the management of NSW forests".

International pressure mounts on the Australian Government's '2017 Review of Climate Change Policies', including 'Land Sector/Forests' and setting post-2020 Targets! Bilateral RFAs make the AG accountable to avoid State Forest emissions from native forest logging, burning and wood-chipping.

AG 'Consultation Papers' will be released in March; 'Submissions' sought in April; and consultation commences at the annual <u>Carbon Market Summit 1-3 May in Melbourne</u> (who else is attending?).

We can start by valuing avoidance of Government-RFA emissions from logging, burning & wood-chipping as 100-Year State Forest Carbon Credits = \$20M+ opportunity to fund Regional Jobs! Australia's hollows-dependent Threatened Species need 100-Year Forest Carbon sequestration.

Lobbying in Jun-Aug 2017 helps shape the AG 'assessments' and 'recommendations'. Australia's 'post-Paris Review' will be completed by October to enable international scrutiny in the lead-up to the Conference-of-Parties. We expect COP 'outcomes' to improve Honest Forest Carbon Accounting, ruling out 'carbon neutral' and 'clean energy' certification based on logs sourced from mature forests.

Native forests logged under "pre-Carbon RFAs" is just one "low hanging fruit" amongst Australia's emission reduction opportunities. Experts say a Carbon 'Method' for State Forests is a "no brainer"! Eucalypt forests are most carbon dense, attracting global concerns about 'RFA Forest Degradation'.

'Great Southern Forest' groups in Bermagui 4-Feb-17 suggested 'no up-front reserves proposals'; instead start work cooperatively with Governments on Carbon Credits across all native State Forests. 3 options include AG Emissions Reduction Fund (ERF), Gold and Verified Carbon Standards (VCS). 100-Year Carbon Credit agreements include a range of protected area and management options:
