The chief scientist's report acknowledged the insufficiency of data of current koala populations and any trends. Citizens who want to report their koala sightings can currently only do that in NSW through the Wildlife Atlas, a cumbersome, user-unfriendly tool unlikely to be used by members of the public. When Bellingen Shire Council adopted its Koala Plan of Management, the area under protection had to be reduced from the original recommendation due to lack of data. We need an easy to use online tool where people can log their sightings, similar to the one available on the 'Save the koala' website (KoalaMap). Here members of the public can register their sightings on an aerial map, provide details such as gender, health, alive or dead and even upload photos. Unfortunately, KoalaMap is not linked to the Wildlife Atlas, which is the reason I have stopped using it to log my sightings.
