To whom it may concern

Please find attached a more detailed submission to the new flying-fox management policy.

I have seen first hand the results of dispersal policy (class 3 actions) in Queensland- this is a disaster for both bats and people as it puts people more at risk of contact with the flying-foxes and places the flying-foxes under stress.

Most colonies in NSW contain the vulnerable grey-headed flying-fox and management plans should be for conservation of this threatened species. There is no evidence that flying-fox numbers are increasing- new movements are instead indicative of stresses from poor food availability.
