
Progress on the Review of the Native Vegetation Regulation

First stage of consultation complete

The first stage of public consultation for the review of the native vegetation regulation is complete. A series of 12 information sessions were held across the state in November.

Thank you to the more than 200 people who attended the sessions. Your input provided valuable information for the review.

Responses from community members at each meeting were recorded. Links to the meeting notes are available on the OEH website as they become available from the Catchment Management Authority.

Next steps

A proposal for changes to the regulation is now being developed. The feedback from all stakeholders, including farmers, foresters and conservationists, is being carefully considered. Those issues raised that are outside of the scope of the regulation are being collated and will be presented to the Government for consideration.

The proposals will be released for public review and comment early in 2012. The public consultation period will run for ten weeks. A second series of information sessions will be held during this time. These sessions will explain the proposed changes and give the community the opportunity to influence the outcome by asking questions and providing further advice and feedback.

The public consultation and information sessions are your chance to influence the outcomes of this review. Opportunities for input will be widely publicised in local and national newspapers, on local radio and on the OEH website. Native vegetation survey
