OEH understands the license is a continuation of a previous license for maintenance activities to be undertaken within areas potentially supporting the threatened Green and Golden Bell Frog.

I certify that the picking/harming of *Litoria aurea* for the purposes of routine maintenance activities on stormwater and road-side drains by Shoalhaven City Council within Culburra, Callala Bay, Greenwell Point and Orient Point is not likely to significantly affect *Litoria aurea* or their habitats and consequently the Proposed Action does not require a licence under the Threatened Species Conservation Act 1995.

An act that is the subject of this certificate is a defence against prosecution under sections 118A-118D of the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974.

The proposed action:

A. Routine maintenance of areas that may comprise Green and Golden Bell Frog habitat within Culburra, Callala Bay, Greenwell Point and Orient Point

The holder of the certificate must ensure that:

- 1. All routine maintenance activities are in accordance with the Green and Golden Bell Frog Operating procedures.
- 2. The specified routine maintenance activities must adhere to the recommended mitigation measures outlined in the Gaia Research (2011) and Eco Logical Australia (2011) reports.
- 3. The s95(2) certificate does not refer to any endangered ecological communities or endangered populations. Any works to be undertaken that could have an impact on an endangered ecological community or endangered population would need to be the sugject of a separate assessment and approval process.

- This certificate is issued under section 95(2) of the Threatened Species Conservation Act 1995.
