Variation of Section 95 Certificate for a buffer in the King George V Avenue grey-headed flying-fox camp, Tamworth

I refer to your email dated 6 June 2017 requesting a modification to section 95 certificate C0002769 to change the distance from roosting flying-foxes for vegetation chipping.

OEH understands that locating vegetation chipping machinery 100 metres from roosting flyingfoxes is impractical, and that the noise from chipping machinery is unlikely cause any significant additional disturbance to the flying-foxes during works.

I have assessed your request in accordance with the provisions of the *Threatened Species* Conservation Act 1995 (TSC Act) and concluded that the proposal is unlikely to have a significant impact on threatened species, endangered populations or endangered ecological communities. The TSC Act makes provision for the issue of a certificate under section 95(2) for actions which technically constitute damage to the habitat of threatened species, but which are unlikely to have a significant impact. Accordingly, I have decided to authorise your activities and issue you with a Section 95(2) certificate.
