Subject: Draft Native Vegetation regulation

Dear Andrew,

The Native Vegetation Legislation has been an infringement on landowner rights to engage in a democratic free enterprise system under our common law jurisdiction as guaranteed by our Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act 1900 (UK) et al Commonwealth of Australia Act 1901.

This legislation and the Draft Native Vegetation Regulation currently before parliament does:-

1. Deny landowners and farmers the right to pursue their economic development and dispose of their natural wealth and resources
thereby being deprived of their means of subsistence
2. In some cases farmers are being denied the right to improve methods of food production by efficient development and use of their
natural resources.
3. Landowners and farmers are being denied the right to free enterprise and self determination.

For anyone taking notice of the path Local, State and Federal governments have been taking over a number of years it becomes obvious many of the policies being introduced are dictated by the United Nations, a foreign entity, setting our parliaments in contradiction of our common law rights and our Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act 1901. Majority of these directives, such as agenda 21, pertaining to land use contain the word "sustainability" and other commonly used buzz words to convince the people you represent it is being done in their best interest when, in fact, you are slowly but surely depriving them of their property rights and ownership.

Slaves have no right to own property and no right to trial by jury. The sovereign people of Australia live in a Democratic Common Law Jurisdiction and as such should reject all legislation contradicting those rights.

I know it is my duty to keep you informed, as my representative, of my will on anything that comes before Parliament, or that should come before Parliament"-

It is MY WILL that you take immediate and on going action to block the Draft Native Vegetation Regulation and repeal the original Native Vegetation Legislation. It is also MY WILL that you introduce into the NSW Legislative assembly the following bill;

"The State of NSW and all political subdivisions (local government, government instrumentalities and authorities) may not adopt or implement policy recommendations that deliberately or inadvertently infringe or restrict private property rights without due process, as may be required by policy recommendations originating in, or traceable to "Agenda 21."
