Important information about completing this application

Only the producer of the waste may apply for a consignment authorisation

Consignment authorisations will **only** be issued to the producer of the waste. ‘Producer’ means a person who produces the controlled waste or a person, authorised by the environment protection agency in the State or Territory where the waste is produced, to act on behalf of the producer. If you apply as an agent on behalf of the producer(s) please attach documentation from the environment protection agency in the State or Territory of origin confirming you are authorised by that agency to act as an agent for the producer in question.

The producer must ensure all information supplied is true and accurate and sign the application. It is a criminal offence to knowingly supply false or misleading information to the Environment Protection Authority in connection with an application.

The EPA will only issue a consignment authorisation to a ‘legal entity’ which is generally either:

- a natural person (i.e. an individual), or
- a company incorporated under the Corporations Law (including a state-owned corporation), or
- a statutory authority (i.e. one recognised by an Act of Parliament as a body corporate).

Consignment authorisations will **not** be issued to business or trading names, in the name of partnerships, or to a division of a corporation (unless the division is incorporated separately).

All required information must be provided on the application form

Please pay particular attention to the following:

- Give your correct legal name as the producer of the waste and include either your Australian Business Number (ABN) or Australian Company Number (ACN).
- Provide the correct name and licence number for the transporter and the waste facility. Do not use business names. Only transporters and facilities specified in the consignment authorisation can be used. If you want to be able to use more than one transporter, details of each must be provided with the application.
- Specify the total quantity of waste to be transported to NSW. If more than one load is expected you need to tell us the **total of all loads** over the period up to a max. 12 months.
- Provide the correct NSW Waste Class. To do this you will need to accurately assess and classify your waste according to the EPA publication, *Environmental Guidelines: Assessment, Classification and Management of Liquid and Non-liquid Wastes*, available on the Department of Environment and Conservation website at www.environment.nsw.gov.au/waste/guidelines.htm or from Pollution Line, phone 131 555. If you have any trouble assessing your waste in accordance with the guidelines, you should get advice from the licensed waste facility where you plan to send the waste or from a consultant familiar with NSW waste assessment criteria. The EPA will not classify the waste for you. If a chemical analysis is required, you **must** include the resulting certified test results from an accredited laboratory with your application.

Applications will only be assessed after the EPA has received a completed application. Failure to provide all required information will delay consideration of the application until missing information is supplied.
