



CONDITIONS OF CONSENT FOR ALPHACHOLOROSE & 'SCATTERBIRD' LICENCES

APVMA is the Australian Government Authority responsible for assessment and registration of pesticides and veterinary medicines.

Bait is the substance that contains the prescribed substance

Bait station: is the container housing the prescribed substance

Baiting area is 'any specific location within the premise where the product containing the prescribed substance is to be used'.

Baiting period is 'any time when the prescribed substance is used at the premise'.

OEH: Office of Environment and Heritage

Premise: The place described on the licence where the prescribed substance is to be applied.

Prescribed Substance is a substance identified in clause 69 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2009* and specified on this licence.

- 1. The consent holder must comply with Australian Pesticides and Veterinarian Medicines Authority (APVMA) label instructions for the product containing the prescribed substance specified on this consent.
- 2. The consent holder must not allow the public access to the baiting area during the baiting period.
- 3. The consent holder must use untreated baits before applying the treated bait containing the prescribed substance to establish whether non-target species are at risk of exposure to the prescribed substance.
- 4. The consent holder must not use the prescribed substance if non-target species are assessed to be at risk of exposure to the prescribed substance.
- 5. The consent holder must:
 - a) Use bait stations designed to retain the bait and are secure from spillage or dispersal
 - b) Position bait stations in locations not likely to attract non-target species
 - c) Ensure that upon completion of the baiting period, the prescribed substance is removed from the premise.
- 6. The consent holder must ensure that all dead and/or affected birds are removed from the premise. If required, effected birds must be humanely disposed of.
- 7. The consent holder must immediately notify OEH of any illness, injury or death the consent holder suspects has been caused to non-target species as a result of the use of the prescribed substance. Specimens may need to be provided by the consent holder.

Personal information collected by OEH in relation to this consent, including any matters relating to your compliance with this consent, may be disclosed to third parties in accordance with the exemptions on disclosure under the *Privacy and Personal Information Act 1998*, for the purposes of confirming information provided by you and for law enforcement purposes.
