



Meeting summary – 24 November 2021 (online)

The National Parks and Wildlife Advisory Council provides the Minister for Environment and Heritage and the NPWS executive with independent, informed advice on the priorities, design and evaluation of NPWS policies, strategies and programs to help achieve the objects of the National Parks and Wildlife Act.

Council also plays a key advocacy role through engagement with stakeholder organisations.

The Council met online on Wednesday 24th November 2021.

Council were briefed on and considered:

- The NPWS COVID-19 response and draft DPIE Vaccination in the Workplace Policy
- Draft Kosciuszko National Park Wild Horse Heritage Management Plan
- Acquisition of land for NPWS reserves
- Increased firefighter capacity
- The National Parks and Wildlife Act Amendment Bill and associated changes to the functions of the Council
- The NPWS Cycling Strategy
- NPWS Carbon Positive Plan
- Status of plans of management and the current PoM program.

Council considered leases and licences for:

- Charlotte Pass Turning Circle, Kosciuszko National Park
- Perisher View Lodge, Kosciuszko National Park
- Pitt Town Sports Club, Scheyville National Park.
