



# National Parks & Wildlife Advisory Council

## Meeting summary – 15-16 February 2022 (online)

The National Parks and Wildlife Advisory Council provides the Minister for Environment and Heritage and the NPWS executive with independent, informed advice on the priorities, design and evaluation of NPWS policies, strategies and programs to help achieve the objects of the National Parks and Wildlife Act. Council also plays a key advocacy role through engagement with stakeholder organisations.

The Council met online on Tuesday 15 and Wednesday 16 February 2022.

Council were briefed on and considered:

- The new Minister and machinery of government changes
- Amendments to the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974 and associated changes to the functions of the Council
- Updates from regional advisory committees (RAC)
- Ongoing improvements and initiatives to campground bookings and digital parks passes
- Multi-use recreational principles
- The draft Accessibility (disability inclusion) Policy
- Recent acquisitions including Brindingabba-Bindra and Killalea State Park and 194 hectares of Koala habitat adjacent to the Lake Innes Nature Reserve
- Gardens of Stone State Conservation Area
- The implementation Kosciuszko National Park Wild Horse Heritage
  Management Plan
- Status of plans of management and the current PoM program
- Leases and Licences under review.
