#### **IN-CAMERA SESSION**

# Item 2 SHR Nominations - Notice of Intention

#### Item 2.1 Wellington Town Common - NOI

The State Heritage Register Committee noted the paper on Wellington Town Common – Notice of Intention.

#### Key points noted:

- o The Wellington Town Common was nominated for SHR listing by the owners, Wiradjuri Wellington Aboriginal Town Common Aboriginal Corporation (WWATCAC).
- o The proposed listing comprises two buildings: a house and a church, as well as an outhouse and the land surrounding the buildings and structure.
- Heritage NSW assessed the item as having potential State heritage significance under three of the seven criteria.
- The Committee discussed the importance of associative values, tangible and intangible values of the site, and cultural landscape significance, and expressed concerns about the proposed smallscale curtilage.
- The Committee sought to confirm the correct title of the listing and noted that Wellington was the first visit on the 1965 Freedom Ride.

The Chair thanked Harvey Johnston and William Truscott for their work and presentation.

#### Resolution 2023-32

The State Heritage Register Committee resolved to defer the item and requested Heritage NSW to:

- 1. Undertake further consultation with the owners regarding curtilage, name of the listing, and potential site-specific exemptions; and
- 2. Undertake further research on associative values and cultural landscape significance.

#### Item 2.2 Bouddi Farm - NOI

The State Heritage Register Committee noted the paper on Bouddi Farm – Notice of Intention.

#### Key points noted:

- Bouddi Farm is likely to be of State heritage significance for its contribution to the development of mid-20<sup>th</sup> century Modernist domestic architecture in Australia and for its associative values as the residence and studio of prominent artist Russell Drysdale.
- Bouddi Farm adjoins Bouddi National Park in Killcare Heights on the NSW Central Coast. Part of its design ethos is its connection to the land and the views.
- Heritage NSW assessed the item as having potential State heritage significance under three of the seven criteria.
- The curtilage includes the detached studio completed in 1971, the house and a generous area of garden and bushland. The part that has been nominated by the owners excludes a small portion of the land that they are intending to sub-divide.

The Chair thanked Alexandra Boukouvalas and Judith Coombes for their work and presentation.

#### Resolution 2023-33

The State Heritage Register Committee:

- Considers the item known as Bouddi Farm at 265 The Scenic Road, Killcare Heights NSW 2257 (see location in Tab B of the report), is likely to be of State heritage significance.
- 2. In accordance with section 33(1)(a) of the Heritage Act 1977, will **give** each person that it considers to be an affected owner or occupier written **notice** that it is going to consider whether or not to recommend the listing of the item concerned (a Notice of Intention to Consider Listing).
- 3. In accordance with section 33(1)(b) and section 33(1)(c) of the Heritage Act 1977, within 14 days after notice of intention to consider listing is given, will cause a **notice** of intention to consider listing to be **published** in a newspaper circulating in the area in which the item is situated, inviting submissions on the listing, specifying a date as the closing date for the receipt of submissions of 28 days after the publication of the newspaper notice and the manner in which submissions may be made.

#### Item 3 SHR Nominations – Recommendation to List

# Item 3.1 Sydney Croquet Clubhouse, its collections, lawns and grounds, Woollahra Park – RTL

The State Heritage Register Committee noted the paper on Sydney Croquet Clubhouse, its collections, lawns and grounds, Woollahra Park – Recommendation to List.

Key points noted:

- o Sydney Croquet Clubhouse is located at Woollahra Park, O'Sullivan Road, Rose Bay.
- The item was nominated by the owner, Woollahra Municipal Council, with a focus on architectural type and values of the building only. Heritage NSW extended the case to include historic and associative values of the clubhouse, including those of its moveable heritage collection.
- Woollahra Municipal Council proposed additional site-specific exemptions in relation to adaptive reuse, change of use, and permissible short term uses, however the Committee queried the value and benefit of those exemptions for the SHR listing.
- Changes that relate to maintenance and management were supported.

The Chair thanked Stuart Read and Natalie Blake for their work.

#### Resolution 2023-34

The State Heritage Register Committee:

- 1. In accordance with section 33(1)(d) of the Heritage Act 1977, has **considered** the submissions received in response to its notice of intention to consider listing at Tab 3.1E of the report and considers the item known as *Sydney Croquet Clubhouse, its collections, lawns and grounds* in Woollahra Park, O'Sullivan Road, Rose Bay, satisfies more than one of the approved criteria for determining whether an item is of State heritage significance, being criteria (a), (b), (c), (e) and (f), as detailed in the report at Tab 3.1A.
- 2. **Recommends** to the Minister, in accordance with sections 32(1) and (2) of the Heritage Act 1977, that the Minister **direct** the listing of the item, Sydney Croquet

- Clubhouse, its collections, lawns and grounds in Woollahra Park, O'Sullivan Road, Rose Bay, on the SHR, as shown in the plan at Tab 3.1C of the report.
- 3. In accordance with section 33(1)(e) of the Heritage Act 1977, **give notice** of its decision to persons notified under section 33(1)(a).
- 4. In accordance with section 57(2) of the Heritage Act 1977, **recommends** that the Minister **grant** the site specific exemptions at Tab 3.1D of the report, as amended, from section 57(1) of the Act in addition to the Heritage Council Standard Exemptions.

# Item 3.2 Manilla Railway Viaduct and Underbridge - RTL

The State Heritage Register Committee noted the paper on Manilla Railway Viaduct and Underbridge – Recommendation to List.

#### Key points noted:

- The Manilla Railway Viaduct and Underbridge located at River Street (Barraba Branch Line),
   Manilla, forms an integral part of the extension of the branch line to Barraba in the 1900s.
- Recommended curtilage goes across 3 public roads and 1 private road (located within the showgrounds).
- Heritage NSW assessed the proposed item to meet four of the seven criteria for listing.
- o 62 submissions have been received in support of the listing and 1 submission objecting.
- o TfNSW, the owner, objects to the listing based on condition and cost of maintenance.
- The Standard Exemptions provide the ability for TfNSW to maintain and repair the structure using traditional materials.
- TfNSW agreed to collaborate with Heritage NSW on Site Specific Exemptions allowing the use of non-traditional materials.

The Chair thanked Margot Stuart and Alexandra Boukouvalas for their work and presentation.

#### Resolution 2023-35

The State Heritage Register Committee:

- 1. In accordance with section 33(1)(d) of the Heritage Act 1977, has **considered** the submissions received in response to its notice of intention to consider listing and considers the item known as Manilla Railway Viaduct and Underbridge at River Street (Barraba Branch Line), Manilla, satisfies more than one of the approved criteria for determining whether an item is of State heritage significance, being criteria (a), (b), (c) and (f), as detailed in the report at Tab 3.2A.
- 2. **Recommends** to the Minister, in accordance with sections 32(1) and (2) of the Heritage Act 1977, that the Minister direct the listing of the item, Manilla Railway Viaduct and Underbridge at River Street (Barraba Branch Line), Manilla, on the State Heritage Register, as shown in the plan at Tab 3.2C of the report.
- 3. In accordance with section 33(1)(e) of the Heritage Act 1977, **give notice** of its decision to persons notified under section 33(1)(a).
- 4. In accordance with section 57(2) of the Heritage Act 1977, **note** that the Heritage Council Standard Exemptions will apply.

# Item 4.2 SHR and AP Listings Process Review update

The State Heritage Register Committee noted the SHR and AP Listings Process Review update by Rebecca Newell.

Key points noted:

- Heritage NSW engaged The Insight Partnership to review the SHR and AP listings processes and provided a progress update with some initial high-level findings, before the final report is presented at the next meeting.
- The review seeks to enhance the effectiveness of internal Heritage NSW processes, support timely processing of nominations, and improve the clarity and transparency of consultation processes through better customer service and community engagement.
- o The review also seeks to set appropriate and meaningful listings KPIs and target outcomes.

In addition to the regulatory processes, the Committee noted the importance of education and celebration of the heritage of NSW and sought to reflect that in the final report.

The Chair thanked Rebecca Newell for the update.

#### Item 5.1 SHR Nomination – Gosford Cenotaph and Cultural Landscape

 The memorial park, including avenue and feature trees, is listed as a heritage item on SEPP (Precincts – Regional) 2021.

 Considers that Gosford Cenotaph and Cultural Landscape, Gosford nomination is not a priority to progress for a full assessment for potential listing on the SHR and the nomination is closed.
