

Enforceable Undertaking

Undertaking given under Section 13.27 of the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016*to the Secretary,

Department of Planning and Environment

Purpose

The purpose of this undertaking is to document undertakings given to the Department of Planning and Environment (the Department) pursuant to section 13.27 of the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* (**BC Act**) in connection with a matter in relation to which the Environment Agency Head has a function under the BC Act.

1. Details of the company or individual giving the undertaking

2. Summary of the alleged contravention
Between 1 January 2015 and 30 March 2020, native vegetation (the Clearing) to be cleared on land known as (the Property) in contravention of section 12 of the Native Vegetation Act 2003 (NSW) (NV Act) and section 60N of the Local Land Services Act 2013 (NSW) (LLS Act). The cleared areas were in Lots and and the native vegetation and the native vegetation areas were in Lots.
3. Details of the alleged contravention, e.g. incident details
The native vegetation was cleared by means of machinery (including a bulldozer) and burning. The Clearing was not authorised under any legislation.
undertook clearing works on the Property which resulted in damage to four distinct plant community types, being PCT37 - Black Box Woodland, PCT49 - Partly Derived Windmill Grass, PCT56 - Poplar Box Belah Woodland and PCT244 - Poplar Box Grassy Woodland.
More than 100 native plants species were affected by the Clearing.
4. An acknowledgement that the Department has alleged a contravention of the NV Act and LLS Act
By entering into this enforceable undertaking, acknowledges the nature of the allegation against him made by the Department in paragraphs 2 and 3 above.
5. Details of any environmental damage that arose from the alleged contravention

The Clearing has caused harm to the environment and represents a significant loss of native vegetation both locally and in the Bogan-Macquarie subregion. Clearing and conversion to cropping has resulted in complete loss of ecosystem function and is an extreme change of land use.

Approximately 750 ha of the Clearing at Sconsidered part of the Endangered Ecological Community (EEC) Coolibah-Black Box Woodland in the Darling Riverine Plains, Brigalow Belt South, Cobar Peneplain and Mulga Lands Bioregions. The Clearing has contributed to a recognised threat to this EEC, namely 'Land clearing for infrastructure, rural and agricultural development and associated activities'.

The environmental harm caused by the Clearing includes:

- a) Loss of approximately 960 hectares of mature floodplain woodland of PCT 37 and PCT 244 that would have contained:
 - i. Large old hollow Eucalyptus trees;
 - ii. Diverse groundcover of native species; and
 - iii. Provided breeding and forage habitat for animals, including threatened species;
- b) Loss of wildlife habitat generally;
- c) Reduced habitat connectivity long the Bogan River floodplain;



- d) Alteration to the natural systems of the floodplain, including the flows of rivers and streams;
- e) Further loss of the Black Box EEC from a known threat, being agricultural activities.
- 6. Details of the restitution that will be made to benefit the environment and the community

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- 1. Enter into a Conservation Agreement with the Department comprising of 1,000ha of land that is suitable by the Department.
- 2. Make payment of \$500,000 to the Department within 12 months of entering this enforceable undertaking, with \$100,000 to be paid upon registration of the Conservation Agreement.
- 7. An acknowledgement that this undertaking may be publicised
 - acknowledges that this undertaking may be:
 - 1. Published on the Department's website,
 - 2. Referenced in materials or documents prepared by or on behalf of the Department
 - 3. Where appropriate, published in newspapers or other publications.
- 8. A statement of capacity to comply with the terms of the undertaking

has the financial ability to comply with the terms of this undertaking.

9. A commitment to ensure that the alleged contravention will not reoccur

commits to ensuring that he seeks the advice of the appropriate authorities, such as Council or Local Land Services, prior to engaging is similar actions.

1. A commitment to the matters in paragraph 6 of this undertaking
