What works well in the proposed policy for managing flying-foxes?

The application of the plan would. 1. Increase information to the residents. 2. Look closer at the health issues. Sleep deprivation should be included. 3. Allow Camp dispersal in certain cases. 4. Allow buffer zone to be implemented. 5. Have degree in levels on how to deal with the individual situation. 6. A suitable and sustainable plan to deal with all potential problems.

What could be improved?

I feel if a situation in an existing camp has changed and now impacts a neighborhood as flying foxes have moved to within 10 meters of properties or Flying foxes start roosting for the first time in an area, people must come first and the situation addressed as soon as possible. The Management and Restoration of Flying-fox Camps, composed at the EcoCentre Griffith University in July 2010 makes some points on page 17 how important the creation of a buffer is to reduce or eliminate conflict.

From your experience are there other things that could be included?

Suitable and ongoing correspondents with the residents in an affected neighborhood as steps are taken to eliminate the conflict.
