The Native Vegetation Act of 2003 provides vital protection for native vegetation and the fauna that are part of the biota. There are significant reasons for continuing and strengthening this protection and not allowing it to be weakened.

The native vegetation protects our vulnerable and very important topsoil from such problems as erosion, waterlogging and rising salt or acids.

Native vegetations gives shelter and helps moderate the climate, including aiding the arrival of rain. The birds eat harmful insects. Birds and other creatures are important pollinators. And it's beautiful too!
