## Appendix 3

### Summary of Recommendations of the Heritage Council of NSW to the Minister for Planning

The Heritage Council of NSW and its committees made the following recommendations to the Hon. Frank Sartor MP, Minister for Planning in 2005-06. The full minutes of Heritage Council meetings and recommendations are available online at [www.heritage.nsw.gov.au](http://www.heritage.nsw.gov.au).

### Heritage Council of NSW

#### **Heritage Incentives Program**

3 August 2005

The Heritage Council recommended that the Minister delegate to the Director of the Heritage Office the power to approve funding under three Heritage Incentives Programs: grants, local government heritage management and grants to organisations.

#### **Redfern Waterloo Authority Delegation**

26 August 2005

The Heritage Council sought the consent of the Minister for Planning to delegate certain functions of the Heritage Council under the Redfern-Waterloo Authority Act to the Director, Assistant Director and Principal Heritage Officers of the Heritage Office.

#### **Braidwood**

21 December 2005

The Heritage Council:

1. resolved that the precinct Braidwood and its setting was of state significance heritage;
2. recommended to the Minister that he direct the listing of the item on the State Heritage Register, if he considered it to be of state heritage significance;
3. recommended that the Minister, in the event of listing, direct the Heritage Office to give timely consideration to the provision of the proposed Project Planning Service for Braidwood;
4. recommended that the Minister grant general exemptions in addition to the Heritage Council standard exemptions;
5. recommended that site specific exemptions be granted for the following developments, provided the Director of the Heritage Office was satisfied the development would not adversely affect the state significance of the precinct: Braidwood Heights Subdivision, Summerfield Council Estate, Little River Road Braidwood, and development applications submitted to the Palerang Council and commented on by the Heritage Office during 2004.

#### **Delegations, Exceptions and Exemptions**

23 March 2006

The Heritage Council:

1. recommended that the Minister for Planning consent to the Heritage Council delegating certain of its functions under section 169 (3) of the Heritage Act to the Approvals Committee, State Heritage Register Committee, Director-General of Planning, and the Executive Director, Director, Director Business Development and Managers of the Heritage Office, Department of Planning;
2. recommended that the Minister revoke the Schedule of Exemptions to Subsection 57(1) of the Heritage Act and grant replacement Standard Exemptions.

#### **Section 170 Endorsement of Heritage Asset Management Strategies**

5 April 2006

The Heritage Council recommended that the Minister consent to the Heritage Council delegating certain of its functions in accordance with section 169(3) of the Heritage Act (Draft Delegation 14.D), to the State Heritage Register Committee, Director-General of Planning, Executive Director and Director of the Heritage Office, Department of Planning.

#### **Redfern Waterloo**

5 April 2006

The Heritage Council advised the Minister for Planning and the Redfern Waterloo Authority that it supported the Redfern-Waterloo Built Environment Plan objective to revitalise the area. The Council also identified heritage items to be added to Schedule 3 of the draft SEPP, and recommended amendments to the draft plan to facilitate the conservation of items of heritage significance.

#### **Transfer of Properties to the Historic Houses Trust**

7 June 2006

The Heritage Council recommended to the Minister, as Corporation Sole, the transfer of the following assets to the Historic Houses Trust:

- Exeter Farm, Heritage Place, Glenwood;
- Rose Seidler House, 69-71 Clissold Road, Wahroonga;
- Tusculum, 1-3 Manning Street, Potts Point;
- Hillview, Illawarra Highway, Sutton Forrest.

The Council also recommended that the Minister make a grant up to a maximum of \$200,000 from the Heritage Conservation Fund to the Historic Houses Trust's Endangered Houses Fund to assist in the conservation
