Heritage Council of NSW

Braidwood Exemption Review

2 August 2006

The Heritage Council:

Resolve that the Heritage Council recommend to the Minister, in accordance with section 57(2) of the Heritage Act, that, by order to be published in the Government Gazette following exemption be granted:

HERITAGE ACT, 1977

Order under Section 57(2) of the Heritage Act, 1977

I, the Minister for Planning, pursuant to section 57(2) of the Heritage Act 1977, on the recommendation of the Heritage Council of New South Wales, do by this Order grant exemptions from section 57(1) of the Heritage Act 1977, described in Schedule B in relation to the land described in Schedule A.

SCHEDULE A

All those pieces or parcels of land in the Parishes of Braidwood, Coghill, Boule and Percy, County of Saint Vincent shown to be within the State Heritage Register curtilage on the plan catalogued HC 2008 in the Office of the Heritage Council of New South Wales.

SCHEDULE B

EXEMPTIONS TO SUBSECTION 57(1) OF THE *HERITAGE ACT 1977*

The following development does not require approval under s. 57(1) of the Act:

1. Integrated development for work to a private owner-occupied house for which consent has been granted by the consent authority which is consistent with the general terms of proposed approval which have been provided to the consent authority by the Heritage Council.

The general terms of proposed approval issued by the Heritage Council may require the submission of an application under s. 60 of the Heritage Act which will prevail over this exemption.

2. Integrated development for which the consent has been modified by the consent authority pursuant to s. 96 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* in a manner which is consistent with any comments provided by the Heritage Council to the consent authority.

NOTE 1: 'Integrated development' and 'consent authority' have the same meaning as in the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*. 'General terms of approval' means the 'general terms of any approval proposed to be granted by the approval; body in relation to the development', as used in Division 5 of Part 4 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

NOTE 2: Integrated development which is exempt under 2 is not subject to the requirement in s. 65A of the Act in relation to modification of existing approvals.

Review of Standard Exemptions

2 August 2006

The Heritage Council:

1. recommend that the Minister for Planning, in accordance with section 57(2) of the Heritage Act, by order to be published in the Government Gazette, revoke the Schedule of Exemptions to section 57(1) of the Heritage Act 1977 published in the Government Gazette on 4 April 2006 and grant the replacement standard exemptions described in Annexure A to the report.
2. revoke the exceptions to sections 139(1) and (2) of the Heritage Act published in the Government Gazette on 18 February 2000 and 4 April 2006 and create, in accordance with section 139(4) of the Heritage Act, by Order to be published in the Government Gazette, exceptions to the requirement for an excavation permit as described in Annexure B to the report.

Review of Delegations to State Agencies

2 August 2006

The Heritage Council resolved to:

1. seek the consent of the Minister, in accordance with section 169(3) of the Heritage Act, to delegate certain of its functions to the Executive Director, Tenant and Asset Management Services of the Sydney Harbour Foreshore

Authority, as specified in column 1 of Schedule A, subject to the conditions listed in column 2 of Schedule A and the general conditions in Schedule B, as contained in Annexure A, in relation to land for which Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority is the consent authority under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 and to revoke the previous delegation to the Director Built Environment, Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority consented to by the Minister on 30 April 2002;

2. seek the consent of the Minister, in accordance with section 169(3) of the Heritage Act, to delegate certain of its functions to the Executive Director Cultural Heritage of the Department of Environment and Conservation, as specified in column 1 of Schedule A, subject to the conditions listed in column 2 of Schedule A and the general conditions in Schedule B, as contained in Annexure B, in relation to land which is managed by the Department of Environment and Conservation, and to revoke the previous delegation to the Manager Cultural Heritage Division of the National Parks and Wildlife Service consented to by the Minister on 5 September 2002; and
3. authorise the Chair of the Heritage Council to sign the instruments of delegation on behalf of the Heritage Council in accordance with the Minister's consent.

Port Macquarie Government House Site

4 October 2006

The Heritage Council recommended to the Minister the provision of a \$70,000 grant to Mr Peter Kuhn to assist with the provision of an on-site interpretative centre within the new 'FOCUS' development at 2 Clarence Street, Port Macquarie.

Revised Section 57(1) Delegations to Historic Houses Trust of NSW

6 June 2007

The Heritage Council resolved to:

1. advise the Minister, in accordance with section 57(2) of the Heritage Act, to:
 - a. revoke the existing exemptions made to the HHT under section 57(2) of the Heritage Act; and
 - b. under section 57(2) of the Heritage Act grant an exemption from all section 57(1) activities to properties owned or managed by HHT and listed on the State

Heritage Register as outlined in Annexure A with the following conditions:

- i. that the Historic Houses Trust provide an annual report to the Heritage Council on future works proposed for its properties;
 - ii. that the Historic Houses Trust advise the Heritage Office archaeologists of any proposed works requiring major excavation at its properties to allow due consideration of the need for additional archaeological work;
 - iii. that the Director of the HHT must lodge all archaeological monitoring or excavation reports prepared with the Heritage Office library on completion after review by Heritage Office archaeologists;
 - iv. that the HHT employ as required a consultant historical archaeologist with appropriate archaeological qualifications, knowledge, skills and experience and the Director of the HHT must obtain the advice of that person about the heritage significance of the archaeological resource and/or the impact of the development proposal on the heritage significance of the archaeological resource, and take that advice into account;
 - v. that the Director of the HHT must take into account as far as practicable the cumulative effect of approvals on the heritage significance of the item and on the heritage resource of its area; and
 - vi. that the Director of the HHT must ensure that approvals are in accordance with any requirements, guidelines, regulations and general conditions issued by the Heritage Council. The Director of the HHT may impose additional conditions which do not conflict with any Heritage Council conditions.
- c. sign the instrument of delegation at in accordance with the Minister's consent; and
- d. in addition to the above the Heritage Council requires a formal annual reporting mechanism to be established under which the HHT would report to the Heritage Office / Heritage Council on its works program for the previous year undertaken under the exemptions. The form this takes can be decided in discussion between the HHT and the Heritage Office.
