**SECTION 95 CERTIFICATE TO UNDERTAKE WORKS ASSOCIATED WITH VEGETATION
MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE, WALKER STREET,
HELENSBURGH**

I refer to your Section 91 licence application received by the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water (DECCW) on 05-Jul-2010 to undertake works associated with the Vegetation Management Plan prepared by Biosis Research (2009) for the Public Recreation Reserve, Walker Street, Helensburgh.

The DECCW understands works will involve bush regeneration activities to treat and remove invasive plant species, seed collection and propagation, revegetation and direct seeding.

I have assessed your licence application in accordance with the provisions of the *Threatened Species Conservation Act 1995* (TSC Act) and concluded that the proposal is unlikely to have a significant impact on threatened species, endangered populations or endangered ecological communities. The TSC Act makes provision for the issue of a certificate under section 95(2) for actions which technically constitute damage to the habitat of threatened species, but which are unlikely to have a significant impact. Accordingly, I have decided to authorise your activities and issue you with a Section 95(2) certificate.

RELEVANT CONDITIONS

The section 95(2) certificate is issued subject to those conditions that appear below.

1. The action shall be carried out in accordance with the licence application dated 5 July 2010 and with the document *Vegetation Management Plan for the Public Recreation Reserve, Walker Street, Helensburgh* (Biosis Research), dated February 2009. Should these two documents conflict, the *Vegetation Management Plan* shall take precedence.
2. Works are to be undertaken as per the NSW DECCW bush regeneration checklist.
3. The licensee may authorise other people (contractors) to work under this certificate, and must maintain a signed register of the people authorised under this certificate. All works must be undertaken by suitably qualified and experienced bush regeneration staff (or contractors).
4. Any seed and propagule material collected under this certificate must be collected as per Florabank guidelines. No collection of seed from DECCW reserves is permitted.
