

Statement from netting contractor regarding physical or topographical constraints to netting a commercial orchard

This statement should be filled out by the netting contractor who has inspected a commercial orchard where it is not possible to install crop protection netting due to physical or topographical constraints.

This statement, plus photographic evidence is required from two different netting contractors to support an application for a licence to shoot flying-foxes under special circumstances, as described in the <u>OEH Policy and procedural guidelines for the mitigation of commercial crop damage by flying-foxes</u>.

Physical constraints include the presence of power lines, pipes or other infrastructure with no options for raising lines, using throwover netting or lowering net height. OEH may accept that power lines prevent netting installation where the minimum clearing distance between the top of the netting structure and the power lines is less than three metres.
