Only those people who have filled in the required information and signed below will be listed on your licence.

You must apply to your local National Parks and Wildlife Service office in writing for any variation to the list of shooters identified below prior to their commencement of work. A shooter variation form is provided on the OEH website.

Note: Any persons authorised under the licence to do the things authorised by the licence are taken to be licence holders for the purpose of the Act and are bound by the licence conditions in the same way as the licensee.

The public register will <u>not</u> include personal information of individuals (e.g. name, postal and email address, phone number and date of birth). Information about the location of plants and animals covered by licences will be restricted to post code.

Please note live flying-foxes should not be handled. Wear protective gloves when handling dead flying-foxes. Further information is provided on the <u>OEH website</u> and Department of Primary Industries Standard Operating Procedures for the shooting of flying-foxes.
