Latest enhancements to BioNet systems

Latest enhancements to BioNet systems (Release 3.2.3) are to be published
Friday 24 Jan 2020

What is happening?

Multiple enhancements are being made to BioNet systems to support the rollout of the new Eastern NSW PCT Classification. This affects both BioNet Vegetation Classification (Public and Edit) and BioNet Atlas applications. Additionally, several bug fixes and minor technical issues, are also being resolved across both BioNet Atlas and Vegetation Classification applications, as well as alignment of branding, legislation and organisational references to reflect the recent move to the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment.

When is this happening?

In order to publish these changes, BioNet systems will be offline Friday, 24 January between 10am and approximately 12:30pm

How do these changes affect you?

For both the BioNet Atlas and Vegetation Classification applications, the main changes are around preparing the applications for rollout of quantitative Eastern NSW PCT's later this year. Additionally, several minor enhancements and bug fixes will also be published at the same time. These changes will not include any changes to plant community type (PCT) data at this stage.

Note the final Release (3.2.4) will occur within the next few months. The main changes will be a new systematic flora survey web service and modifications to existing web services to support the rollout of the quantitative Eastern NSW PCTs.

An update to the BioNet user manuals is planned for release in March 2020, to incorporate these and other updates.
