	<ul> <li>increasing. Kangaroo numbers strong but currently not a problem for farmers.</li> <li>Demand for kangaroo is steady. Industry (AWGIC) is seeking to gain access to the Vietnam market. Progress is slow.</li> <li>LLS and Kangaroo Management Taskforce (KMT) focusing on delivering local projects, looking at kangaroo management in context of Total Grazing Pressure (TGP).</li> <li>LLS contributing to department policy team working on outcomes of the BC Act review, regarding Aboriginal community access to resources for cultural purposes. Need for engagement with Aboriginal communities with continuing connection to Country.</li> <li>Currently no chillers operating in the Walgett area. Kangaroos that are culled are going to waste – considered a poor outcome by local Aboriginal people.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>544,317 kangaroos harvested</li> <li>5.6% of the estimated population</li> <li>36.7% of the quota</li> <li>87% were male (up from the long term average of 75%)</li> <li>Average weights remain steady – average male weight 29kg, average female weight 19.5kg</li> <li>Licences to harm 231,452 kangaroos were issued, with a maximum possible 166,612 kangaroos culled under those licences</li> <li>Top 5 zones, based on harvest as a percentage of the quota: Griffith South (75%), Broken Hill (67%), Cobar (63%), Griffith North (53%) and Lower Darling (52%)</li> <li>More detail in the 2024 Annual Report</li> </ul> Current stats, as at 10/05/2025	Circulate link to 2024 Annual Report	Sheridan

5.	Other business		
	<b>WTMP</b> – the current NSW Wildlife Trade Management Plan for the commercial harvest of kangaroos expires 31 December 2026. KMP has started planning for the review of the current plan and preparation of a new draft plan for submission to the Australian Government in mid-2026. There will be a period of community consultation for public submissions on the draft plan.		
	KMP will engage with KMAP in August/September.		
	The 5-year term of the current KMAP also ends 31 December 2026. KMP will also seek the views of the current panel.		
	<b>Licence fees –</b> KMP will be reviewing the current cost-recovery model. Any proposals for change would involve further consultation.
