

We're upgrading Bittangabee Bay precinct

The precinct will be closed from mid June to early December 2022, with the Light to Light walk staying open



Bittangabee Bay precinct is a hugely popular recreation spot in the Green Cape area of Ben Boyd National Park. The campground provides a sense of remoteness and is suitable for motorhomes, camper trailers, tents and packcampers.

Why is this work required?

Upgrades are required to provide high quality experiences to a broad range of visitors while reducing environmental impacts and increasing Aboriginal cultural heritage protection.

What improvement will be made?

• Environmental benefits

The upgrades will provide long term environmental benefits through improved erosion and sedimentation mitigation measures. Improvements to the precinct's roads will also reduce ongoing maintenance costs.

 Aboriginal Cultural Heritage
 A cultural camp with new amenities will be available for the local Aboriginal community.
 Aboriginal cultural heritage assets present in the area will be better protected through improved erosion controls.

- New and improved day use facilities The new designated day-use carpark will increase visitor safety. The picnic area will be equipped with barbecues, tables and a shelter to cater for the needs of day-use visitors.
- New and additional amenities for all campers Additional amenities will improve the visual amenity and the disabled access of the campground. A new walk-in campground will be established for Light to Light walkers as well as school groups doing the walk.

Planning your visit

The NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service is currently undertaking the tender process required to award the contract for these upgrades. The Bittangabee precinct will be closed mid June to early December 2022. The beach will be accessible to those walking the Light to Light, or by boat or kayak. Bittangabee Bay Road will be closed, at the junction of Green Cape Road, to vehicle and pedestrian traffic.
